CREATING A NEW GENERATION OF LIFESAVERS

A Heart Day 2018' on Tuesday this week, part of a national campaign to give the gift of life-saving skills to as many people as possible. Students explored the workings of the heart in Science, and all of our Year 7s and Year 8s got to grips with the essentials of CPR using kits supplied by the British Heart Foundation. Volunteers from East Midlands Ambulance Service were joined by staff from the Fire Service and the NHS in delivering these vital hands-on workshops. National statistics show that there are more than 30,000 cardiac arrests outside of hospital every year and the survival rate right now is only 1 in 10. Whilst we hope that our students will never have to call upon their training, we are proud to know that they could if they needed to because, as the British Heart Foundation suggest, they just need to remember that when the stakes are this high, 'don't think twice, just try'. We are now looking forward to putting an extended First Aid training course together for enrichment and will share details soon.
