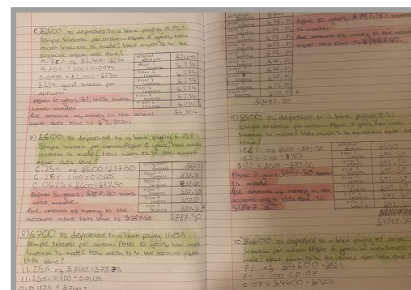
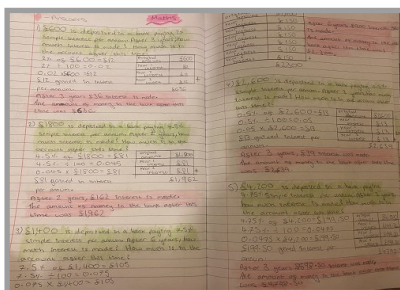

FEATURE TEACHER

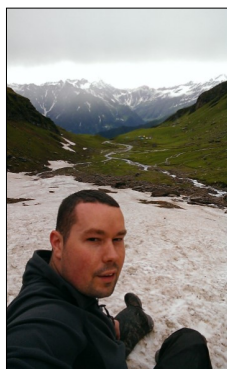
Mr Wiles is the Head of Design & Technology here at The Suthers School and as he can't meet you in person yet, here's a little information to start getting to know him...

Teacher journey: I undertook a Graduate Teacher programme to enter the teaching profession having finished university and have subsequently topped up with a PGCE qualification. My interest in teaching began when I tutored young offenders and school excluders for a charitable organisation. I enjoyed it so much that I decided on teaching as my chosen career path.

Background: I am originally from Luton. I went on to study Contemporary Furniture and Product Design at the University of Buckinghamshire. My first teaching role took me to Coventry, then Bedford and most recently to Perthshire in Scotland where I was a Head of DT in a Boarding School. I wanted to come back down to England so that I can spend more time with my family.
