# ART STUDENTS INSPIRED BY INDUSTRY EXPERT

This week Year 8 students were excited to welcome a local designer, Scott Wroe, Head of Creative, from Timico in Newark. The aim of the visits was to elevate the students' learning about the street artist, graphic designer, social activist and illustrator, Shepard Fairey. Each form group enjoyed two sessions with Scott where he led them through the use of Adobe Photoshop. The



sessions taught the students to respond to a design brief through taking an image, importing it into Photoshop and manipulating the image to echo the stylisation associated with Shepard Fairey. Some brilliant examples were produce and we look forward to hosting another event soon.
