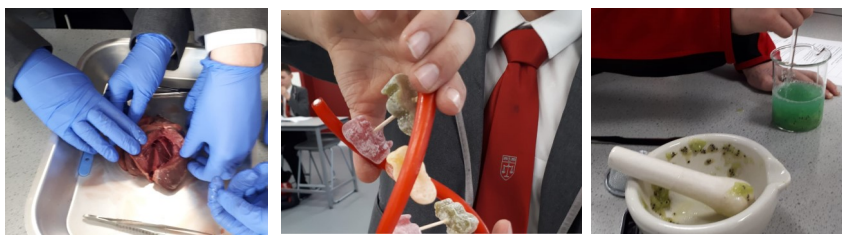

EXCITING SCIENCE INVESTIGATIONS

Our scientists of the future have been busy considering some big questions in their recent learning. Year 10 were considering, 'Can you die from a broken heart?'. To gain the knowledge needed for this question they observed the structures of the heart including the aorta, vena cava and coronary arteries.

Our year 8s have been learning about DNA in their lessons. To learn about the structure of DNA they made models using jelly babies and pencil sweets to replicate the four bases and then also extracted DNA from a kiwi fruit.
