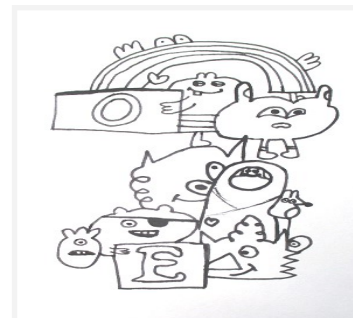
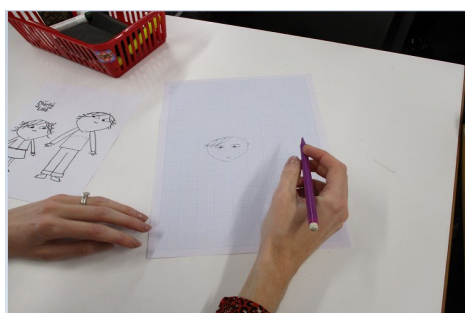
## In Brief:
